The Mayor declared the meeting open for the transaction of business and the following business was transacted:

A motion made by W. O. Harrison to dispense with the reading of the minutes of the last meeting was seconded by D. C. Ware and passed by unanimous vote.

A motion was made by D. C. Ware to send a copy of a resolution to the Carthaginian, expressing our sincere appreciation for the interest shown and publicity given us in an editorial of a recent issue of the Carthaginian, on behalf of the water and sewer system bond issue election for the Town of Walnut Grove, Miss. Said motion was seconded by W. O. Harrison and passed by unanimous vote.

A motion was made by D. C. Ware to authorize Mac Dawson to negotiate with radio station WMAG, Forest, Mississippi, for a spot announcement of the water and sewer system bond issue election for the Town of Walnut Grove, Mississippi. MINUTES OF A RECESSED MEETING OF THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN
OF THE TOWN OF WALNUT GROVE, MISSISSIPPI, HELD ON WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER
6~~14~~, 1960.

BE IT REMEMBERED THAT, pursuant to an order duly entered by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Walnut Grove, Mississippi, at its last regular meeting held on Tuesday, the 6th day of September, A. D., 1960, which order is of record in Minute Book 2, Page 46, of the Minutes of said Board, said Mayor and Board of Aldermen met in recessed session at 7:00 o'clock, P.M., in the Town Office, at the Town Hall of said Town, for the purpose, among other business, the following business:

- (a) The fixing of the tax levy to be for the year 1960-61;
- (b) To receive from the Election Commissioners of said town their report of the results of the election relative to the issuance of \$40,000.00 general obligation bonds for the purpose of paying a part of the cost of a waterworks and sewer system for said town;
- (c) To receive from the Election Commissioners of the Town their report of the results of the election relative to the issuance of \$124,000.00 water and sewer revenue bonds for the purpose of paying a part of the cost of such systems for said town;
- (d) To do each and every act and thing necessary and requisite to the issuance of \$40,000.00 general obligation bonds of said town for the purpose of paying a part of the cost of a water works system and sewer system for said town, including the advertising of the sale thereof;
- (e) To do each and every act and thing necessary and requisite to the issuance of \$124,000.00 water and sewer revenue bonds of said town for the purpose of paying a part of the cost of a water works and sanitary sewer system for said town, including the advertising of the sale thereof;
- (f) To do every thing necessary and requisite in the premises to effect the above purposes;
- (g) Any other business pertaining to the business of the town that may come before said business.

The meeting was called to order by the Mayor. There was present, W.C. Dawson, Mayor, and Aldermen D. G. Ware, B. M. Stewart, Elvin Hanna, Mac Dawson and W. O. Harrison. The following business was transacted, to-wit:

IN THE MATTER OF LEVYING THE AD VALOREM TAXES FOR
THE TOWN OF WALNUT GROVE, MISSISSIPPI, FOR THE
FISCAL YEAR, 1960-61

There came on for hearing and determination by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Walnut Grove, Mississippi, on this the 14th day of September, A. D., 1960, the matter of levying the ad valorem taxes for the fiscal year 1960-61, beginning October 1, 1960, on assessments of property as of January 1, 1960, for said town, and fixing the tax rate, or levy, for the said town, in accordance with the provisions of Section 3742.23, Mississippi Code of 1942, as amended, and other laws relative to said matter; and the Mayor and Board of Aldermen having fully and carefully considered the needs and requirements of the various funds of the town, and the rate, or levies, which are required to produce the revenue necessary to meet the budget as made, fixed and heretofore approved by this Mayor and Board of Aldermen, as required by law, and it appearing that the tax rates, or levies, for the general revenue and general improvement purposes, for the maintenance, upkeep and construction of streets, and for the purpose of paying the interest coupons as they become due on all bonds of the town hereafter to be issued, and the bonds themselves, are necessary in order to raise the funds required to meet the expenses of the town for said fiscal year; and,

Said matter having received careful consideration of said Mayor and Board of Aldermen, and it appearing that all of such levies or rates are justified, required, and authorized by law,

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED AND ADJUDGED by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Walnut Grove, Mississippi, that the following ad valorem tax rates, or levies, be and the same are hereby imposed and levied for the fiscal year 1960-61, upon the assessed value of all taxable property in the Town of Walnut Grove, Mississippi, as the said property is now assessed and listed, or as may hereafter be assessed and listed, upon the assessment rolls of said

Town, as of January 1, 1960; except for motor vehicles, which are to be assessed as provided in Section 10007-01, et seq., Mississippi Code of 1942, as recompiled, the said rates, expressed in mills or a decimal fraction of a mill, being levied and imposed upon each dollar of assessed valuation appearing upon the assessment rolls of said town as aforesaid, for the following funds or purposes; and when the money is collected, it shall be credited to the respective funds as provided by law.

Section 1. There is hereby levied upon each dollar of assessed valuation in the town for the purposes hereinafter set forth, the rate in mills as hereinafter set forth:

For General Revenue Purposes and for General Improvements, known as General Fund, as fixed and limited by Ch. 496, Laws of 1950, Mills 15.00

For Street Maintenance, UpKeep and Construction Purposes, as authorized by Section 3374-166, Miss. Code of 1942, as recompiled, this being a town with less than 1,000 people as shown by the last Federal Census, and other related statutes, to be carried as Street Fund, 2.00

For the Payment of the interest coupons as they become due on all Waterworks and Sewerage Systems Bonds hereafter to be issued as result of an election held September 10, 1960, and for the payment of all bonds of said town of and for said sewerage and waterworks systems as they become due, during the next fiscal year, as authorized by Section 3374-115, Mississippi Code of 1942, as recompiled, to be carried as Waterworks and Sewerage Systems Interest Sinking Fund for Waterworks and Sewerage Systems Bonds of 1960. 10.00

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Walnut Grove, Mississippi, that all ad valorem taxes hereby levied and imposed are fixed within the limits as stated in Section 9883, Mississippi Code of 1942, as recompiled, and related Statutes; the General Revenue Taxes being governed by said Section 9883, Mississippi Code of 1942; the street taxes being governed by Section 3374-166, Mississippi Code of 1942; and the taxes for Waterworks and Sewerage Systems Interest Sinking Fund for Waterworks and Sewerage Systems Bonds of 1960, being governed by Section 3374-115, Mississippi Code of 1942.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the above rates, or levies, in mills, or a decimal fraction thereof, shall be applied to each dollar of

assessed value as is shown by and upon the 1960 assessment rolls of the Town of Walnut Grove, Mississippi, and motor vehicles, as authorized by Chapter 588, Laws of 1958, and that it is the intention of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Walnut Grove, Mississippi, to comply, fully and in detail, with all the requirements of law relating thereto, and especially with Section 3742.23, Mississippi Code of 1942, as recompiled, and any and all other related statutes.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that all money received and collected by the Town Tax Collector, as far as said tax levies apply to property other than motor vehicles, and by the Tax Collector of Leake County, Mississippi, insofar as said tax levies apply to motor vehicles, shall be paid over to the Town Clerk and credited by her to the proper fund according to the provisions of this order, and shall be credited to the designated fund by the Town Clerk, in accord with the budget as heretofore adopted by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen, and shall be expended in the manner and for the purposes as set forth in said budget and for no other purposes.


IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Town Clerk be, and she is hereby expressly directed to comply with all the requirements of law prescribed by Section 3742-24 of the Mississippi Code of 1942, relating to the certification and publication of the ad valorem rates or levies herein made and fixed; provided, that there being no newspaper published within this town, a copy of this resolution and order shall be posted in at least three public places in the said Town of Walnut Grove, Mississippi, within ten days from and after this date.

The above having received the affirmative vote of all members of the Board of Aldermen present, it is

Gentlemen:

We, the undersigned, Election Commissioners within and for the Town of Walnut Grove, Leake County, Mississippi, do hereby certify as follows:

1. That, acting under and pursuant to a certain resolution adopted by you on the 11th day of August, A. D., 1960, entitled "A RESOLUTION CALLING AND PROVIDING FOR THE HOLDING OF A SPECIAL ELECTION ~~WITHIN THE TOWN OF WALNUT GROVE, MISSISSIPPI, AT WHICH THERE SHALL BE SUBMITTED TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF SAID TOWN CERTAIN PROPOSALS FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONSTRUCTING A WATERWORKS SYSTEM AND A SANITARY SEWERAGE SYSTEM FOR SAID TOWN,~~" notice of said election was published in the Carthaginian, a newspaper published in Leake County, Mississippi, and having a general circulation in said Town of Walnut Grove, Mississippi; said notice having been published in said newspaper on the 18th and 25th days of August and on the 1st and 8th days of September, 1960, all as shown by the publisher's affidavit and proof of publication, with clipping attached, which is annexed to this report and marked Exhibit "A"; and notice was posted in three public places in said Town by the Town Clerk as shown in affidavit of posting of notice attached as Exhibit C.
2. That, as required by Section 3239 of the Mississippi Code of 1942, we, the undersigned, did meet at the office of the Registrar, in Walnut Grove, Mississippi, on Monday, the 5th day of September, 1960, being five days before the date of the aforesaid election, and did carefully revise the registration books and the poll books of said Town and did erase therefrom the names of all persons erroneously thereon, or who had died, removed, or become disqualified as electors from any cause, and did register the names of all persons who had duly applied to be registered and who had been illegally denied registration.

3. That said election was duly held on Saturday, the 10th day of September, 1960, at the polling place designated in the aforesaid resolution; said polls being opened at eight o'clock A. M. and being closed at six o'clock P. M. on said date.

4. That the official ballots supplied for and used at the aforesaid special election were in the form as prescribed in the aforesaid resolution of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen, and a printed counterpart of the said official ballots is attached to this report and marked Exhibit "B".

5. That on the 10th day of September, 1960, we did hold and conduct said election and make the returns thereof and did then find and do now declare that the number of votes cast for and against each of the propositions submitted at said election, to-wit:

PROPOSITION NO. 1

"Shall the Town of Walnut Grove, Mississippi, issue its general obligation bonds in the maximum amount of Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000.00) for the purpose of paying part of the cost of constructing a waterworks system and appurtenant facilities and a sanitary sewerage system and appurtenant facilities in and for said Town?"

PROPOSITION NO. 2

"Shall the Town of Walnut Grove, Mississippi, issue its waterworks and sewerage systems revenue bonds in the maximum amount of One Hundred Twenty-four Thousand Dollars (\$124,000.00) for the purpose of paying part of the cost of constructing a waterworks system and appurtenant facilities and a sanitary sewerage system and appurtenant facilities in and for said Town?"

The Mayor and Board of Aldermen having seen, read, and considered the report of the Election Commissioners, Alderman D. C. Ware offered and moved the adoption of the following resolution:

A RESOLUTION APPROVING THE REPORT OF THE ELECTION COMMISSIONERS WITHIN AND FOR THE TOWN OF WALNUT GROVE, MISSISSIPPI, IN RELATION TO A SPECIAL ELECTION HELD IN SAID TOWN ON SEPTEMBER 10, 1960, AND DECLARING THE RESULTS OF SAID ELECTION.

WHEREAS, heretofore, to-wit, on the 11th day of August, 1960, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Walnut Grove, Mississippi, did adopt a certain resolution entitled "A RESOLUTION CALLING AND PROVIDING FOR THE HOLDING OF A SPECIAL ELECTION WITHIN THE TOWN OF WALNUT GROVE, MISSISSIPPI, AT WHICH THERE SHALL BE SUBMITTED TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF SAID TOWN CERTAIN PROPOSALS FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONSTRUCTING A WATERWORKS SYSTEM AND A SANITARY SEWERAGE SYSTEM FOR SAID TOWN"; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to said resolution, notice of said special election was given and said election was held in accordance with and as required by the Laws of the State of Mississippi and by the aforesaid resolution of this Mayor and Board of Aldermen; and

WHEREAS, the Election Commissioners within and for the Town of Walnut Grove have filed with this Mayor and Board of Aldermen their report concerning the results of said election, wherein it is shown that the propositions voted upon at said election were as follows:

WHEREAS, it appears from the aforesaid report of the Election Commissioners that One Hundred Forty-eight (148) votes were cast on the aforesaid Proposition No. 1, of which One Hundred Forty-five (145) votes were cast "FOR THE BOND ISSUE" and Three (3) votes were cast "AGAINST THE BOND ISSUE"; and

WHEREAS, it further appears from the aforesaid report of the Election Commissioners that One Hundred Forty-eight (148) votes were cast on the aforesaid Proposition No. 2, of which One Hundred Forty-five (145) votes were cast "FOR THE BOND ISSUE" and Three (3) votes were cast "AGAINST THE BOND ISSUE";

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF WALNUT GROVE, MISSISSIPPI, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. That the aforesaid report of the Election Commissioners within and for the Town of Walnut Grove, Leake County, Mississippi, relating to the special election held in said Town of Walnut Grove on Saturday, the 10th day of September, 1960, shall be and the said report is hereby approved and confirmed.

SECTION 2. That the following proposition submitted to the qualified electors of said Town of Walnut Grove at the aforesaid special election, to-wit:

PROPOSITION NO. 1

"Shall the Town of Walnut Grove, Mississippi, issue its general obligation bonds in the maximum amount of Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000.00) for the purpose of paying part of the cost of constructing a waterworks system and appurtenant facilities and a sanitary sewerage system and appurtenant facilities in and for said Town?"

was assented to by a majority of three-fifths (3/5ths) of the qualified electors of said Town voting thereon at said election.

SECTION 3. That the following proposition submitted to the qualified electors of said Town of Walnut Grove at the aforesaid special election, to-wit:

PROPOSITION NO. 2

"Shall the Town of Walnut Grove, Mississippi, issue its waterworks and sewerage systems revenue bonds in the maximum amount of One Hundred Twenty-four Thousand Dollars (\$124,000.00) for the purpose of paying part of the cost of constructing a waterworks system and appurtenant facilities and a sanitary sewerage system and appurtenant facilities in and for said Town?"

was assented to by a majority of the qualified electors of said Town voting thereon at said election.

SECTION 4. That the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Walnut Grove, Mississippi, are now authorized to issue general obligation bonds of said Town in the amount of Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000.00) to raise money for the purpose of paying part of the cost of constructing a waterworks system and appurtenant facilities and a sanitary sewerage system and appurtenant facilities in and for said Town as provided for by the aforesaid Proposition No. 1, and that said bonds shall be issued as may hereafter be directed by this Mayor and Board of Aldermen.

SECTION 5. That the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Walnut Grove, Mississippi, are now authorized to issue waterworks and sewerage systems revenue bonds of said Town in the amount of One Hundred Twenty-four Thousand Dollars (\$124,000.00) to raise money for the purpose of paying part of the cost of constructing a waterworks system and appurtenant facilities and a sanitary sewerage system and appurtenant facilities in and for said Town as provided for by the aforesaid Proposition No. 2, and that said bonds shall be issued as may hereafter be directed by this Mayor and Board of Aldermen.

Alderman W. O. Harrison seconded the motion to adopt the foregoing resolution, and, the question being put to a roll call vote, the result was as follows:

Alderman D. C. Ware voted Yea;

Alderman B. M. Stewart voted Yea;

Alderman Elvin Hanna voted Yea;

Alderman Mac Dawson voted Yea;


Alderman W. O. Harrison voted Yea.

The motion having received the affirmative vote of all the Aldermen present, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution adopted.

It was further ordered that the Exhibits "A" "B" and "C" of the report of the Election Commissioners, dated September 12, 1960, be inserted in these minutes on the next two succeeding pages, and the Clerk be, and she is hereby directed so to do.


There being no further business to come before the Mayor and Board of Aldermen, on motion duly made and seconded, the meeting was by the Mayor declared adjourned.


